












Important instructions for those with Panasonic or Olympus cameras

(Canon, Sony, Ricoh, Kodak are not affected)

Your camera films videos in an Apple format (*.mov), which means that the program we are going to use, Microsoft Windows MovieMaker 2, refuses to recognize it. We therefore have to convert it to a format that it can recognize.

The easiest way I have found to do this is to use a free online converted known as "zamzar". (One disadvantage of this program is that it may use your address for Spam).

<p>Go to www.zamzar.com</p> <p>Ignore the ads and the free offers.</p>	
<p>Step 1 Browse for your file</p> <p>It may have the suffix ".mov" or an icon with a blue Q</p>	
<p>Step 2</p> <p>Choose avi from the dropdown menu,</p> <p>This format worked with me.</p>	
<p>Step 3</p> <p>Enter your email address.</p> <p>Use any email address, work, home, web.</p>	
<p>Step 4</p> <p>Click on convert</p>	

<p>You'll see this message</p> <p>Click on "OK"</p>	
<p>Down near the bottom you'll see that it is converting.</p> <p>This may take some time, so do not close the window.</p>	
<p>Once you see this message you can close Explorer and go to your e-mail account.</p>	
<p>The e-mail may take some time (minutes) to come but when it does, open it and click on the link in the middle.</p>	
<p>Click on Download Now</p>	
<p>Click on Save and save it where you can find it again.</p>	
<p>You should now be able to use it with MovieMaker now. Give me a call or email if you have any difficulties.</p>
